ROYAL VISIT.

Her Majesty's Astronomical Observations at Waikiki.

Yesterday evening at 7 o'clock Her Majesty paid a visit to the observatory of Professor Marcuse, the German astronomer, by that gentleman's invitation.

Prof. Marcuse conducted Her Majesty into the observatory, where he had chairs in position for the party's comfort. The professor then gave a short lecture on the history of the problem to aid in the solution of which he came to Honolulu.

When Her Majesty and party had feasted their eyes on celestial things, Prof. Marcuse conducted them to the American observatory. Here Prof. Preston in charge explained his instruments to the distinguished company.

SIX MILLIONS IN IT.

Six of Chicago's Biggest Houses Purchased by English and Home Capitals.

Chicago, May 9.—Six great packing concerns at the stockyards of the International Packing Company, the T. E. Wells Company, the Allerton Company, Jones & Stiles, Hatley Brothers and the establishment of John C. Conely—have been purchased by an international corporation, part American and part English.

The six concerns have a capacity for slaughtering and curing 10,000 hogs a day in the summer and 15,000 in the winter with all the requisite improved refrigerating plants and accessories.

The prospectus of the new company will not be issued for a fortnight, but the contracts have all been signed and the details of financing agreed upon.

Of the \$6,500,000 securities of the new International Packing and Provision Company, limited, about one-half has been taken by the vendors. The bonds have been taken by a syndicate of local banks.
