TO SHOW HAWAII AT BUFFALO



W. Maurice Tobin, who was briefly introduced to readers of the Republican yesterday morning and whose portrait is now presented to them, was crowned "King of the Midway" at the great Chicago Fair. Born at Newburyport, Mass., 32 years ago, Mr. Tobin has been a showman from childhood. His regal title was given him on account of his great success as a midway talker. He has a scrapbook with scores of writeups of his talent in that line published in leading papers of the Union.

A midway spieler comes the nearest to being "the whole thing" for anything that isn't such which could be imagined. He can make or break the success of the show for which he touts. Upon him devolves the task of stampeding the multitude of promoters along the avenue from rival shows to that of his employers, when reluctance or distrust is in the air, and to get the most people into the show for which he is the displayed and vocal advertisement when new and unsophisticated throngs bent on getting all the fun their money will buy are surging into the plaisance. Indeed the war of words between spieler of adjacent exhibitions is sometimes more entertaining than the fantastic and grotesque sights and performances behind the respective screens. These rivals for jaw championship have a hard time of it during the height of a great fair. They are upon the pedestal from 10 a. m. to midnight, scarcely taking time to snatch a mouthful of refreshment. As Mr. Tobin said in a Buffalo interview: "The spieler eats and sleeps in the

winter. Newspaper work is a calm and peaceful sleep compared to a busy midway." Those who are good ones, however, command fancy salaries or coin wealth rapidly in commissions.

Mr. Tobin's visit here is to prepare himself thoroughly for the best sort of work as talker for the volcano of Kilauea cyclorama, incidentally also to gather material for a Hawaiian industrial exhibit and aid in recruiting talent for the Hawaiian village. John H. Wilson will accompany him on a visit to the crater, to Maui and Molokai to Ewa plantation and other points of interest.

"I intend to put Hawaii before America as never was done before," said Mr. Tobin yesterday afternoon. "Yes, arrangements have been made for having the natural and manufactured products of Hawaii exhibited in the appropriate departments of the Exposition proper. Part of my errand here is to look up articles of native handicraft and engage experts for the actual manufacture of hats, fans and mats on the ground in presence of the crowds. It is not a question of money with the concessioners but of representation from this end of the line."

"Six weeks ago a show was given of the volcanic exhibition before the Director General. He said the electrical effects were the most beautiful he had ever seen. Among other representations made is one of a tropical storm. In the eruptions produced in the crater, real live steam is made to issue from cracks and blowholes in the counterfeited lava."
