Kalaau, Hawaiian male, 80 years of age, died at Waikiki last Wednesday. A postmortem examination was held by Dr. Hoffmann, who declared the cause of death to be oedema pulmonum. Burial certificate granted for Manoa church cemetery.

### FRIDAY'S RECORD.

K. Yamamoto, Japanese male, 26 years, died at Japanese lodging house at Puunui; postmortem disclosed cause of death to be heart disease. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Kalani, Hawaiian female, 84 years; died at Kalihi-waena; postmortem disclosed typhoid fever as the cause of death. Burial certificate granted for Kalihi church cemetery.

**John Henry Mossman, Hawaiian male, 8 months old, died at Waikiki; tuberculosis was the cause of death and was attended by Dr. Day. Burial certificate granted for Kawaiahao cemetery.**

Ah Lung, Chinese male, 5 years old, died at Kewalo; a postmortem examination was held by Dr. Hoffmann and typhoid fever given as the cause. Burial certificate granted for Pauoa cemetery.

### SATURDAY'S RECORD.

Amakawa, Japanese male, 1 week old, died at Kakaako; attended by Dr. Kojima and meningitis given as the cause of death. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Mary Ahia, Hawaiian female, 48 years; died at Lelele; attended by Dr. Jobe and tubercular phthisis given as the cause. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Keahi, Hawaiian male, 33 years; died at Niolops, Nuanuu Valley, of general tuberculosis; attended by Dr. Herbert. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Sakaki, Japanese male, 31 years; died at Kerosene detention camp of typhoid fever; attended by Dr. F. A. Bowman. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Stillborn male infant of D. Mitsui, Japanese; died at Kamoilili; attended by Dr. Kojima. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

### SUNDAY'S RECORD.

Pookapu, Hawaiian female, 68 years, died on Queen street, near Punchbowl, of Bright's disease; attended by Dr. Alvarez. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

Annie Poohina, Hawaiian female, 6 months; died at Pauoa of bronchitis; attended by Dr. Miner. Burial certificate granted for Pauoa cemetery.

### YESTERDAY'S RECORD

Adolf Dzanwasek, Austrian male, 2 months; died at Kewalo of diarrhoea; attended by Dr. Alvarez. Burial certificate granted for the Catholic cemetery.

Kimano, Japanese female, 31 years; died at Kerosene camp of typhoid fever after a postmortem examination by Dr. Hoffmann. Burial certificate granted for Makiki cemetery.

### Kauai March Term.

The following cases were disposed of at the opening day of the Kauai term of the Circuit Court at Lihue, Wednesday, the 7th instant:

The only Hawaiian criminal case on the calendar, that of the Republic of Hawaii vs. Iosua, for selling spirituous liquor without a license, defendant forfeited bail of \$105.

In the case against Ah Tau, for unlawful possession of opium, it was continued to the next term, as also the case against Kawamoto, for assault with a deadly weapon, defendant having escaped from the custody of the Sheriff.

Ah Kui, larceny, appeal from Halei, defendant pleads guilty and

is discharged, he being sufficiently punished.

Ah Kon Chan, assault and battery, appeal from Waimea, forfeits bail of \$25.

Man Sau, assault and battery, appeal from Kawaihau, pleads guilty and is fined \$10 and \$3.50 costs.

Pokahi (w.) vs. Kekoaalulii, divorce. Granted. Kaseo for plaintiff.

## BY AUTHORITY.

### ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS QUARANTINE.

While a period of quarantine continues, no person, without a permit from the Board of Health, or an agent of the same, shall be allowed upon, or in, any wharf, vessel or place which has been put in quarantine, whether such quarantine has been established to protect such wharf, vessel or place, or in consequence of infection therein. No person shall deliver upon, or receive from, a quarantined wharf, vessel or place, any goods, parcel or thing, unless by permission of the Board of Health or an agent of the same.

### REGULATIONS FOR SHIPMENT OF FREIGHT.

OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH,  
HONOLULU, H. I., March 10, 1900.

Shipments of goods to the other Islands may be made under the following conditions and restrictions:

1. The "Kinau" and I. I. S. N. Company wharves shall be kept as quarantine wharves.
2. Goods of America and English production or manufacture may be shipped if in original unbroken and tight wood or metal containers, said containers to be subjected to disinfection by acid solution at said wharves.
3. Goods of American and English production or manufacture in original packages, or in re packed containers, providing such containers have openings left equal to one-eighth the surface, may be taken to the P. M. S. S. dock for fumigation by sulphur for twelve hours.
4. Machinery and corrugated iron, after acid disinfection.
5. Coin, which must have been boiled, after acid disinfection of container.
6. Rice, if prepared direct from paddy under supervision of an agent of the Board of Health at Hopper's rice mill, packed in new sacks and delivered in covered drays direct to the wharf, without further treatment.
7. Flour, feed, fodder, fresh vegetables and fruits from new quarantined wharf, or from clean vessels in the harbor, only.
8. Coal, in bulk or bags, brick, lime, cement, fire clay, and acid fertilizers without treatment.
9. Lumber, to be thoroughly wet with salt water at the vessel, and in all cases to be discharged into the water at point of destination.
10. A charge for disinfecting and fumigating as indicated may be made by the transportation companies.
11. No responsibility is assumed for damage arising in connection with treatment of goods.
12. Goods of such nature that damage would likely be sustained, from either of the methods mentioned, may be shipped without further treatment, provided they are kept in the hot air plant at a temperature of 230 degrees F. for one hour, and a certificate to that effect accompany the goods; transfer to be made on covered drays to wharf.
