Certificates of Deaths.

FRIDAY'S RECORD.

Kawahe-lili, Hawaiian male, 2 1/2 months; died at Auwaolimu, off Punchbowl street and below the Mormon church, of diarrhoea; attended by Dr. Alvarez, Makiki cemetery.

SATURDAY'S RECORD.

Infant of Y. Ahnin, Chinese male, 19 days; died at Kapalama, in Desha lane, of inanition; attended by Dr. Herbert; Pauoa cemetery.

Fredericke Charlotte Schimmelfennig, German female, 62 years; uraemia was the cause; attended by Dr. Day; Nuuanu cemetery.

SUNDAY'S RECORD.

Anna Mano, Hawaiian female, 4 year; died on Punchbowl street, Auwaolimu, off Relief camp, of angina tonsillaris; attended by Dr. Burgess; Kawaiaho cemetery.

Naone, Hawaiian male, 40 years; died at Ah Leong's tenement house on Queen street of cerebral hemorrhage according to autopsy held; Makiki cemetery.

Shikayo Takemoto, Japanese female, 2 months; died of dyspepsia; at the new Ice Works, Kewalo attended by Dr. Mori; Makiki cemetery.

MONDAY'S RECORD.

Tcon Moon, Chinese male, 28 years; died at Kapalama, on taro land mauka of Reformatory school of typhoid peritonitis, according to postmortem examination held by Dr. Hoffman; Pauoa cemetery.

Infant female child of Katayama; died of premature birth at Relief camp No. 1; attended by Dr. Mitamura; Makiki cemetery.

YESTERDAY'S RECORD.

Amakawa Kanichi, Japanese male, 10 months; died at a lodging house on Allen street, Kakaako, of cholera infantum; attended by Dr. Mitamura; Makiki cemetery.

Inouye, Japanese male, 24 years; died at Kerosene camp of typhoid fever; attended by Dr. Bowman; Makiki cemetery.

The Political Plague.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 21.—The bubonic plague is supposed to have produced three recent deaths in Chinatown and the Board of Health has appointed a force of 250 men to destroy undesirable or dangerous structures or fixtures, burning tainted food and fumigating noisome places.

Glands from the three subjects which have now puzzled the authorities are under examination, but no positive verdict has been rendered by Dr. Kinyoun, the Federal bacteriologist, and Dr. Kellogg in the municipal service. The authorities will neither assert nor deny that the cases are those of bubonic plague.

The Chronicle of March 21 says: "If the members of the Board of Health would display half the energy in the transaction of the legitimate duties of their department as they have shown in their shameful effort to fasten the bubonic stigma upon the city, they might hope ultimately to see their connection with 'one of Phelan's boards' forgiven. Unfortunately, the outfit, from the Mayor down, seems to be unmindful of the welfare of San Francisco. In its wild efforts to obtain 'vindication' for its first ridiculous error of alleged plague, the Board is willing to run the risk of ruining the city for an indefinite period. It has now come boldly to the front with the claim that it has unearthed three more 'suspicious' cases.

"While there is every reason for believing that these 'suspects' will amount to no more than the first case, the Board has been able to hoodwink the Finance Committee of the Board of Supervisors into agreeing to provide at least \$7,500 with which to inspect Chinatown."

"Of the three cases which the Board has under investigation are those of a Chinese who died a week ago, and a second and third man who died Sunday. Physicians signed the death certificates of the first and last named men, giving pneumonia and heart trouble as the disease in the first case, and pneumonia in the second. In spite of this fact the inspectors take charge of the bodies and ordered autopsies held. Dr. Kinyoun, the Federal bacteriologist, is assisting Dr. Kellogg, the bac-

teriologist of the Board of Health, in the investigations. As the result of preliminary examinations of parts of glands of the first two cases the physicians expressed the belief that the cases looked 'much like the bubonic plague.' A quarantine was established on the Onida place, and the other places were disinfected.

The Chinese Consul General, Ho Yow, is in receipt of a communication from Dr. Elmer Lee, chairman of the American Medical Association, commending the part which Ho Yow took in protesting against the recent blockade of Chinatown, and condemning the local Health officers as alarmists."
