An answer has been filed by de-
fendant in A. S. Cleghorn, adminis-
trator, vs. W. R. Castle, in the suit
for accounting.

An affidavit has been filed in A.
G. Merricourt vs. Norwalk Insur-
ance Co., signed by the rest of the
jurors who heard the case as to the
good conduct of J. C. Cluney, one
of the jurors, during the trial, and
that he did not in any wise try to
influence, control or persuade the
others in giving their verdict.

Defendants in Lum Ah Lee et al.
vs. Ah Soong et al., by their attor-
neys, Robertson & Wilder, have filed
a motion to dissolve temporary in-
junction, and also a demurrer.

Return of service in the suit for
false imprisonment brought by Sam
Furushima against the bark Semi-
nole has been returned as being com-
plied with according to directions.
An exception has also been filed by
Chipman Taylor, master, to the libel.
J. Alfred Magoon and I. M.
Long for libellant, Humphreys &

Russia Aggrieves Germany.

Berlin, March 15—An unpleasant
impression has been created here by
the speech of Chaplain Malcheff of
the Russian Embassy at the launch-
ing of the Russian warship Askold
yesterday. His remarks contained
no allusion to Emperor William,
who was present, beyond a reference
to the fact that his Majesty is a
Russian Admiral.

It was reported last evening in
court circles that a Russian Grand
Duke who had been expected to at-
tend the launching found an excuse
not to come upon learning that Em-
peror William would attend and
would follow this speech with Rus-
sophile remarks, which Russia does
not desire.

Equine Extravagance.

The sale of the 19 horses in train-
ing, property of the late Duke of
Westminster, realized the sum of
\$370,000 or an average of nearly
\$19,500. Flying Fox, by Orms out
of Vampire and winner of the Two
Thousand, the Derby and the St.
Leger, was bought to go to France
by M. E. Blanc for \$196,000 thus
establishing a record which his
grand sire Ormonde previously held,
he having been disposed of to Mr.
McDonough for \$164,000. Vane an
own sister to Flying Fox was secured
by the Prince of Wales for \$22,500.
