 Lui Maikui, Hawaiian male, 8 months; born and died at Kakako, the second turn on Punchbowl street, after 3 months' sickness, of hereditary syphilis and bronchitis; attended by Dr. Kojima; Catholic cemetery.

Mary Kauha Johanson, Hawaiian female, 23 years; born in Kona, Hawaii, and died on Punchbowl street, above the Mormon church, after 7 months' sickness, of phthisis pulmonalis; attended by Dr. Cooper; Makiki cemetery.

FRIDAY'S RECORD (May 11)
 Stillborn infant of Kabelemauna, Hawaiian male; born and died at Kalia, makai of Queen street; attended by no physician; Kawaiahoe cemetery.

Uma, Hawaiian male, 61 years; born at Hilo, Hawaii, and died in Manoa valley, about 2 miles below H. E. Cooper's residence, after one year's sickness, of pneumonia; attended by Dr. Garvin and a post-mortem examination held; buried on a kuleana at Manoa.

S. K. Kahai, Hawaiian male, 55 years; died at Kapahulu, Waikiki, near the Kapahulu road, after a few days' illness, of congestion of the lungs; attended by Dr. Wood; Nuuanu cemetery.

Infant of Leung Chow, Chinese female, 10 days; born and died at Iwilei, near the wash houses, after 4 days' sickness, of gastro enteritis; attended by Dr. Miner; Pauoa cemetery.

J. G. Nobrega, Portuguese male, 55 years born in the Madeira islands and died on Kinau street, near the mauka corner of Quarry road, after 4 years' sickness, of heart disease; attended by Dr. Alvarez; Catholic cemetery.

John Ahai, Hawaiian male, 11 months; born and died on Nuuanu avenue, near Vineyard street, after 3 days' sickness, of gastro intestinal catarrh; attended by Dr. Mitamura; Makiki cemetery.
