ried male, 42 years; born at St. Mi-
chael's and died at the Queen's Hos-
pital, after two months' sickness, of
an abscess of the liver; a resident of
Waisiua and came from the Wai-
lia plantation; attended by Dr.
Cooper; Catholic cemetery.

THURSDAY'S RECORD (May 17.)
David Koko, Hawaiian male, 1
year and 8 months; born and died
at Kakaako, on east side of new Iron
Works, after six months' illness, of
phthisis pulmonalis; attended by
Dr. Alvarez; Kawaiahao cemetery.

FRIDAY'S RECORD (May 18)
Torakichi Kagihara, Japanese
male, 2 days; born and died on Wai-
kiki Road, near King street turn,
after one day's sickness, of atelect-
asia pulmonalis; attended by Dr. So-
ga; Makiki cemetery.

Annie Meyer, German female, 9
months and 20 days; born in Hono-
lulu and died at Apua, off Queen
street, near Mililani, after two days'
sickness, of meningitis; attended by
Dr. Alvarez; Nuuanu cemetery.

Kilikia, Hawaiian female, 20 years;
born at Hana, Maui, and died at Ka-
lihi-waena, opposite Hawaiian Fer-
tilizer Works, after ten days' sick-
ness, of typhoid fever and pneumo-
nia; postmortem examination by Dr.
Howard; Makiki cemetery.

Tang Wing Yo, Chinese male, 35
years; born in China and died on
Quarantine Island, after ten days'
sickness, of pneumonia; had only
arrived here from China per steam-
ship City of Peking; attended by
Dr. Garvin; cremated the following
day.

Auaukaba, Hawaiian female, 60
years; died at the Queen's Hospital,
after five months' sickness, of syphi-
lis and fatty heart; attended by Dr.
Wood; Moanalua cemetery.

SATURDAY'S RECORD (May 19).
Infant of A. Toogood, part-Ha-
waiian male, 8 hours; born and died
at the Kapiolani Maternity Home,
of premature birth; a tended by Dr.
Hodgins; Catholic cemetery.

Kiailani, Hawaiian married fe-
male, 58 years; born in Puna, Ha-
waii, and died on Vineyard street,
near corner of Nuuanu, after one
year's sickness, of cirrhosis of the
liver; Dr. Garvin was called in after
death; Makiki cemetery.

**Anna Kavanagh, part-Hawaiian
female, 62 years; died in the Queen's
Hospital, after two weeks' sickness,
of pleurisy with effusion; attended
by Dr. Cooper; Kawaiahao cem-

Lum Hing, Chinese male, 56 years;
born in China and died at the Chi-
nese Hospital, after one year's sick-
ness, of hemiplegia; attended by
Dr. Hodgins; Manoa cemetery.

Cloudy Title Admitted.

A temporary injunction was is-
sued, on the petition of Kapiolani
Estate, Ltd., against Mary H. Atch-
erley, Alice K. Spencer, Rebecca
Kinimaka and Percival M. Kinim-
moka, restraining them from pro-
ceeding with suits of ejectment
against the plaintiff for the prop-
erty at Queen and Punchbowl streets
and certain property on Molokai,
claiming \$20,000 damages in each
case. A bond of \$1000 has been filed
in the injunction proceedings by
plaintiff as principal and Samuel
Parker and A. N. Keopikai as sure-
ties. The plaintiff contends that
defendants are attempting to take
advantage of a gap that it admits in
the title. Richard Armstrong was
on May 5, 1858, appointed guardian
of three minor children of Kinimaka
and was ordered by the probate
court on November 2 following to
convey the lands in question to
David Kalakaua, from whom the
plaintiff claims a clear line of title.
It appears Armstrong never obeyed
the order, hence the gap in the title.
The plaintiff prays, among other
things that defendants, as the hold-

ers of the interest of the Kinimaka
minors, may be ordered to make a
conveyance to it of all their right,
title and interest in the lands under
dispute which they have derived
from the will of Kinimaka. Kinney
Ballou & McClanahan are attorneys
for the petitioning corporation.
Charles Creighton, Lyle A. Deacy
and Frederick W. Hackey are attor-
neys for defendants.

The Chess Club Revived.
A chess club, of which Dr. A. N.
Sinclair is president, S. S. Ballou
secretary, and A. V. Gear treasurer,
was organized last evening at the
Waverley club rooms.

Dr. Sinclair occupied the chair.
The question of dues was discussed,
and membership in the Waverley
club was eventually adopted in con-
nection with membership in the
chess organization. The dues of the
Waverley club are \$1.50 a month,
and those of the chess players were
placed at 50 cents a month.
