W. S. Gossage, non-resident American male, 27 years; born in California and died at the Queen's hospital of acute myocarditis; attended by Dr. Wood; Nuuanu cemetery.

Mrs. Noelekahoaka, Hawaiian married female, 28 years; born at Honokaa, Hamakua, Hawaii, and died at Kukuluaeo, Kakaako, after one month's sickness, of phthisis; attended by Dr. Herbert.

Mrs. Ed. Saffery, Hawaiian married female 70 years; born at Olowalu, Maui, and died at the corner of Cooke and Hustace streets of heart disease; Dr. Garvin called in after death; Catholic cemetery.
