Chas. Swansen, Danish male, 23 years; born in Denmark and died in the Queen's hospital, where he was removed from the ship E. B. Suttor, after 3 months and 15 days illness, of tuberculosis of the spine; attended by Dr. Wood; Makiki cemetery.

Carl Buchholtz, German married male, 70 years; born at Wusterhausen, Germany, and died off Punchbowl street, beyond Mormon church, after two months' illness, of chronic valvular disease of the heart; attended by Dr. Taylor; Nuuanu cemetery.

H. Kubota, Japanese male, 24 years; born in Japan and died in the Japanese hospital, Kapalama, after 21 days' illness, of typhoid fever; attended by Dr. Mori; Makiki cemetery.
