M. Tonouye, Japanese male, 44 years; born in Japan and died in the Victoria Hospital, after being there for 39 days, of phthisis; attended by Dr. Bowman; Makiki cemetery.

L. K. Halualani, non-resident Hawaiian married male, 52 years; born on Molokai and died in rear of the Chinese Y. M. C. A., after 17 days' illness, of dysentery; attended by Dr. Wood; removed to Kalauoa, Ewa, Oahu. (He represented the Ewa District in the Legislature of 1896.)

Kumalolo, Hawaiian male, 71 years; born at Hauula, Oahu, and died in the Lunalilo Home, after a few days' illness, of old age; attended by Dr. Wood; Makiki cemetery.

Kaaua, Hawaiian male, 66 years; born in Honolulu and died in the Victoria Hospital, after being there for ten days, of phthisis; attended by Dr. Bowman; Makiki cemetery.

Marie de Souza, Portuguese female, 7 months; born and died on South street, near Queen, after three days' illness, of acute enteritis; attended by Dr. Walters; Catholic cemetery.

Nakagawa Iwago, non-resident Japanese male, 30 years; born in Japan and died at the end of Dowsett Lane, Kapalama, after half an hour's illness, of cardiac paralysis; attended by Dr. Haida; Makiki cemetery.

Kuramoto Kenji, Japanese male, 21 years; born in Japan and died in the Japanese Hospital, after 18 days' illness, of peritonitis; attended by Dr. Mitamura; Makiki cemetery.
