Court Notes.

Plaintiff in Sarah A. Berger vs. C. W. Booth et al. has filed a motion for an order to issue a commission for the examination of C. F. Humphrey, of San Francisco, he being considered a material witness. Interrogatories are annexed as well as a motion for hearing. Geo. D. Gear, one of plaintiff's counsel, makes affidavit of the facts deemed necessary in the main motion. Another motion is also filed to continue cause.

Judge Humphreys has signed an order in the guardianship matter of Henry Federhen, a minor, that the clerk of the Judiciary pay him \$75 to enable said minor to procure testimony showing that he has arrived at the age of majority and to employ counsel, if he may be so advised. The Court has declined the prayer of the petition, but has ordered the Clerk to pay to the minor \$30 per month for his maintenance until the first of next year, at which date he will be of legal age, and the balance of his share to be finally paid to him.

Anie Roach, widow and administratrix of the estate of D. W. Roach, deceased, has filed her bond for \$750 with J. D. McInerney as surety, and is approved by the Court.

Defendant in the ejectment suit of Chang Yau vs. Ching Hong Cho has filed answer of general denial to plaintiff's complaint.

A confession of judgment in The Risdon Iron & Locomotive Works vs. Maunalei Sugar Co., Ltd., has been filed by the defendant corporation.

In J. Hanlon vs. J. Vivichaves, assumpsit, a stipulation has been filed by the respective counsel that the cause may be tried in vacation and be brought to trial on five days notice.

A license to practice law in the Courts of this Territory has been granted to W. J. Robinson by the Supreme Court on his own petition, endorsed by U. S. District Judge Morris M. Estee.
